2017 State Summit well attended - Focus on FAC legislative priorities

The State Summit was held in Tallahassee February 8-10, 2017. The Summit opened Wednesday evening, Feb. 8th with a reception hosted by FAC at the DoubleTree. The Sixty-four registered delegates met Thursday morning for breakfast and legislative briefings from Senator George Gainer (R-Panama City), Chair of the Senate Transportation Committee, Senator Jeff Brandes (R-St. Pete), Chair of the Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation,

Tourism and Economic Development, Representative Brad Drake (R-DeFuniak Springs), Chair of House Transportation and Tourism Appropriations Subcommittee, and Mr. Tom Byron, Assistant Secretary, Florida Department of Transportation. Ms. Cissy Proctor, Executive Director, Florida Department of Economic Opportunity, also briefed the FAC general membership during their Feb. 9th meeting.

FAC 2017 State Legislative Priorities The Board of Directors also met on Feb. 9th. State Affairs Committee Chair, Gary Duncan, presented the Council's priorities:

1. State Funding for the Airport Development Grant Program

Florida Airports depend upon state funding for support of important infrastructure projects. FAC SUPPORTS funding for the Airport Development Grant Program that is no less than that proposed by Governor Rick Scott in his proposed budget for the Work Plan 2017/18 - \$251,356,907.00. *The House and Senate are expected to submit their budgets in week one or two of the legislative session that begins March 7th.*

2. Ride Share Services

Florida's airports must preserve their ability to regulate and charge commercial operators operating on airport property and to maintain compliance with FAA grant assurances. *FAC is working with Bill sponsors in the House and Senate to craft language that protects airports. FAC is proposing the following language relating to SB 240: "This section does not prohibit an airport from charging reasonable fees for use of the airport's facilities or designating locations for staging, pickup, and other similar operations at the airport."*

3. Concealed Weapons & Firearms in Terminals/Airport Areas

FAC is OPPOSED to any legislation related to concealed weapons and firearms which alters the areas of an airport where a person is prohibited from openly carrying a handgun or from carrying a concealed weapon or firearm. *Several Bills have been introduced in both chambers relating to conceal carry and open carry of weapons/firearms in airport terminals.; recent proposed amendments continue to prohibit open or conceal carry in an airport terminal or sterile area of an airport.*

4. Sales Tax on Aircraft Sales and Leases

FAC SUPPORTS the elimination of the state's sales tax on the sale or lease of all aircraft in the State of Florida. *Bills have been introduced in the House and Senate; the House version is now in Transportation and Infrastructure Subcommittee.*

5. Trespass on Airport Property

FAC supports legislation that makes trespassing on the secure area and the Air Operations Area (AOA) of an airport a Felony of the Third Degree. *No Bills have been introduced to date, but airports are considering if this language could be added to a criminal just bill already drafted.*

AIRPORT MEMBERS IN THE NEWS

From cabbie to airport CEO, Joe Lopano honored for billion-dollar vision behind Tampa International's transformation (Source: Tampa Bay Business Journal)

Tampa International Airport's CEO Joe Lopano was feted recently as the Person of Vision by Preserve Vision Florida, which offers eye care to children and adults. In his acceptance speech, Lopano harkened back to his immigrant roots and his past jobs. He made jokes and discussed the airport's master plan.

"I'm so thankful for the sacrifices of my immigrant grandparents, who came over in a sea crossing with very little money but great faith," Lopano told the audience. "I've been a shoeshine boy, delivery boy, bartender, a stock clerk, a fireman, a mail room clerk and a cab driver, to name a few. And I wouldn't change any of it," he said.

"I learned so much during this time. I learned about hard work, about determination and always trying to be the best at whatever you are doing — whether that be driving a cab or stocking shelves," he continued. "But, only in this country can a cab driver become a CEO of a major U.S. airport. And, only in this county can a mail room clerk rise to the level of being invited to the White House to meet with the President of the United States."

Preserve Vision Florida, in the program, noted that "Lopano's visionary leadership has inaugurated the transformation of one of Tampa Bay's vitally important links to the nation and world." The *Tampa Bay Business Journal* named him the Power 100 Person of the Year in December. Currently, Lopano is presiding over the airport's nearly \$1 billion expansion, which will increase the footprint of its main terminal, build both a new rental car facility and a 1.4-mile automated people mover, and add concessions.

Since becoming head of the airport in 2011, he and his TIA team have attracted new international and domestic, nonstop routes into Tampa. Passenger traffic to Europe increased more than 50 percent in 2016, and TIA is targeting new routes within the U.S. and abroad. Among

them are flights on Southwest Airlines to Havana, Cuba, which began last December, and flights to the international airport in Keflavik near Iceland's capital city of Reykjavik via Icelandair starting September 2017. That route will open up about 25 European destinations to Tampa. Additionally, flights to San Francisco — a much-in-demand flight — began Feb. 16 on United Airlines.

PGD launches therapy dog program

PGD announced a new Therapy Dog Program on Monday, February 13th. Therapy K9's of Southwest Florida introduced 8 registered therapy dogs and 6 were "working" in both the departure and bag claim areas during the event held at the Punta Gorda Airport. A therapy dog is a dog trained to provide affection and comfort to people in a variety of locations and situations from hospitals, nursing homes, schools, hospices, disaster areas, people with autism, children advocacy centers, and in airports.

Flight delays, cancellations, long security lines and checked-bag scenarios are the most common aggravations among airline travelers. Additionally, air travelers have stress regarding the purpose of their travel whether for business, vacation, family gathering, etc. Currently, over 20 airports across the United States have therapy dog programs.

Therapy K9's Charlotte County Coordinator, Kim Corby is thrilled to be able to share one of her Therapy Dogs, Fansee, with airport passengers. Fansee is a calm, patient, English Cream Golden Retriever who occasionally wears costumes to help when she is working with small children. The costumes help younger children open up and feel more at ease when they are placed in stressful situations such as testifying in court or being interviewed by law enforcement officers. Some of the other Therapy Dogs include breeds like German Shepherd, Pug, Pitbull and Chocolate Lab/Greyhound mix.

Director of Aviation, Ron Mallard, said, "This Program is a way to ease the anxiety and stress associated with air travel and we are glad the Therapy K9's of Southwest Florida can offer their services to our Punta Gorda Airport passengers."

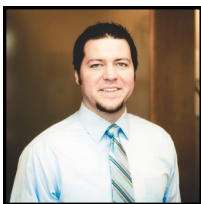

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GKN Aerospace to bring 170 jobs to Bay County

The St. Joe Company and the Bay Economic Development Alliance announced that a large aviation company is coming to Bay County. GKN Aerospace, "one of the world's largest independent first tier suppliers to the international aviation industry," will expand its operations by locating a new manufacturing facility in Venture Crossings® Enterprise Centre.

The company intends to lease a new manufacturing facility, which will be developed and owned by a subsidiary of St. Joe and designed to meet GKN Aerospace's specific requirements. "With this new facility, GKN Aerospace plans to make a capital investment of approximately \$50 million and create 170 new jobs for highly skilled employees," EDA officials wrote in a news release.

"We are pleased that a company of the stature of GKN Aerospace will be bringing high quality aerospace manufacturing jobs to Bay County," said Jorge Gonzalez, The St. Joe Company's President and Chief Executive Officer. "Manufacturing has a high economic multiplier effect so we remain committed to working with the Bay County EDA and other partners to continue to attract quality job creators."

Those comments were echoed by Mike Grunza, CEO of GKN Aerospace's Aerostructures North America business.

"This investment emphasizes our commitment to manufacturing in North America, as this new world-class facility will create jobs and strengthen our competitive position in the US aerospace market for the future," Grunza said. "The excellent support we have received from Bay County EDA, Governor Rick Scott's office, higher educational partners and The St. Joe Company made Florida an ideal location for GKN."

St. Joe officials added that the Venture Crossings business park is a "Florida First Sites" Certified Site. "Florida First Sites is a regional site certification program for project-ready sites in the State of Florida. Each certified site undergoes a rigorous screening process, ensuring that pre-work has been complete, taking the majority of

the risk out of the site selection process," they wrote. The site is anchored by Northwest Florida Beaches International Airport, major arterial highways and several nearby Florida Gulf Coast military installations.
